The new CPR

- Purpose: Establishes EU-wide harmonised rules and common technical language for marketing construction products, ensuring safety and environmental performance.
- First as a Directive in 1989, EU regulation in 2011 and revision in 2024
- Published in the OJEU on 18/12/2024
- Key Updates:
 - Strengthen standardisation processes
 - Enhance of sustainability
 - Promotion of digital transformation





Towards Circularity

- Provision of environmental information over the entire lifecycle of construction products
- Long term harmonisation for used construction products
- Possibility to set product requirements to improve resource efficiency
- Instructions for use and product safety information:
 - Recommendations for a products end of life
 - Maintenance
- Digital product passport to ensure availability of information
